Theta Phi Alpha Announces Installation of Delta Omicron Chapter at Southern New Hampshire University

BAY VILLAGE, Ohio – The Grand Council of Theta Phi Alpha is pleased to announce the installation of the Delta Omicron Chapter at Southern New Hampshire University in Manchester, New Hampshire on Sunday, Jan. 24.

This was the second virtual installation of a new chapter for Theta Phi Alpha due to the limitations of the COVID-19 pandemic. The day kicked off with the Initiation Ritual welcoming 27 collegians and two alumnae initiates into the Fraternity, followed by an installation ceremony. Leading the day's virtual gathering was Tracey Liphardt, AN, National President. In addition, Tracey was joined by the remaining Theta Phi Alpha Grand Council members, several National Officers, Past National Presidents, supportive alumnae members, collegians, and Michelle Scali, Southern New Hampshire University Assistant Director of Student Involvement.
