Sue was a graduate of Northern Illinois University with a degree in education. She began her career with Theta Phi Alpha at National Office in 1992. Sue was named National Office Executive and became an alumna initiate of our Alpha Xi Chapter at Cleveland State University. Sue's warm and engaging manner touched the hearts of many sisters and our Panhellenic friends from the moment she met them, even if just by telephone. Many of these relationships grew into true friendships over the years. She received Theta Phi Alpha's Outstanding Alumnae Mentor Award at the National Convention in 2014 as a testament to the many ways her guidance, love, and encouragement helped our sisterhood to flourish and grow, both as an organization and as individual members.
